The Secretary General of the Interparliamentary Assembly on Orthodoxy (I.A.O.), Member of the Hellenic Parliament Dr Maximos Charakopoulos sent a message of Condolences to the Panafrican Parliament and the Anglican Church of Southern Africa on the passing of the Nobel Peace Prize winner Archbishop of the Anglican Church Desmond Tutu, noting:

But, even after the elimination of apartheid, Desmond Tutu did not stop criticizing, until the end of his turbulent life, phenomena of corruption, new forms of inequalities and human rights violations, always defending the weak.

His bright personality will continue to shine not only among his compatriots but all over the world, remaining an indelible example of offering to fellow human being and respecting the life of every person, as taught by the Word of Christ, whose Birth we celebrate these days".
